Celebrating JMJ's 50th Anniversary

JMJ celebrated its 25th anniversary in 1997. Here is an excerpt from the 1996-1997 Annual Report.

When the JMJ Children's Fund was founded at Christmas time in 1972, there were only three of us packing cloths and supplies for the orphanage in Korea, in a large storeroom kindly provided by the Ottawa Citizen. Subsequently most of our efforts were geared toward fund-raising to meet a commitment to help the orphanage in Korea, where the Sisters has been praying for help.

Over the years, JMJ Children's Fund has assisted an orphanage in Ghana, refugees during the Vietnam war, a home for children in Ecuador and a Clinic for handicapped children in Chad. Now, we continue to support schools in Haiti and Malawi, and orphanage in Congo-Kinshasa and 2 students on scholarship in Dominican Republic. These will be reported more completely under desk reports.

Until 5 years ago we took part in Charity Bazaars at the various malls – Carlingwood was the most profitable. But now the malls not longer encourage this sort of activity. We held art exhibitions and sales, utilizing the work of Ottawa artists. Other

sources of funds were periodic raffles which helped us meet our commitments. All of this takes devotion, time and sacrifice on the part of our Board members and their friends.

According to our archives, our love story with JMJ Children's Fund started more than twenty years ago. Dr. J Ferrari has always been our contact

person, and a very generous one each time we asked for help. She is always an inspiration to us when we receive her kind words of encouragement and feel her compassionate heart for the most unfortunate children. Immense gratitude to Dr. Ferrari and to all the benefactors of JMJ!

JMJ has mainly helped our poorest missions in Haiti and Africa. We have 8 schools in Haiti with a total of 6142 children and Africa (Malawi and Zambia) counts 2 primary schools and 4 kindergartens with a total of 813 children.

We, the Missionary Sisters of

the Immaculate-Conception firmly believe that education is the only way to lift a country out of poverty. We also do our utmost, through education, to instill in the children human and Christian values and bring them to know our God and be grateful for the gift of Life.

In Haiti, the JMJ grants went to children affected by disasters, like the earthquake of 2010, the hurricane Matthew in 2016 and the earthquake de 2021 where two of our schools were completely destroyed in the South, les Cayes. Moreover, at the same time, every year JMJ has helped our Center of Scolarisation which uses the classrooms of the regular program of the morning, for children-in-service and over-aged students who study in the afternoon. The children-in-service are orphans or children of big and poor families who have temporarily been given to other families to help with domestic chores in exchange of board and lodging. Very often these children need psychological help which JMJ has provided. Other schools have also benefited from resources of JMJ for students who cannot pay their school fees. Those who have reached secondary school are forever grateful to the benefactors.

In Africa, JMJ has continuously assisted our Immaculate Heart of Mary Kindergarten, Chipata, Zambia. There, the children helped are orphans whose one or the other parent died of HIV-AIDS. Very often the orphans are taken care of by the grand-parents or other members of the family or village. It goes without saying that these children need support for proper clothes, school supplies and school fees to go to school. Even if the endemic HIV-Aids has decreased significantly in the last years, many people still suffer and die from this disease.

Congratulations to JMJ who has, during these last fifty years, greatly contributed to the betterment of our humanity. Our society may think it is a drop of water in the ocean of world problems, but in the eyes of God I am convinced it is GREAT and you are GREAT!

What's even harder for us: armed bandits stole the school's car while the driver was buying medicine in the General Hospital Zone in the city center. It's the chaos that we live in Haiti these days.
